c) The hydrogen belonging to an aldehyde will show up between 9-10 ppm in the H NMR spectra.

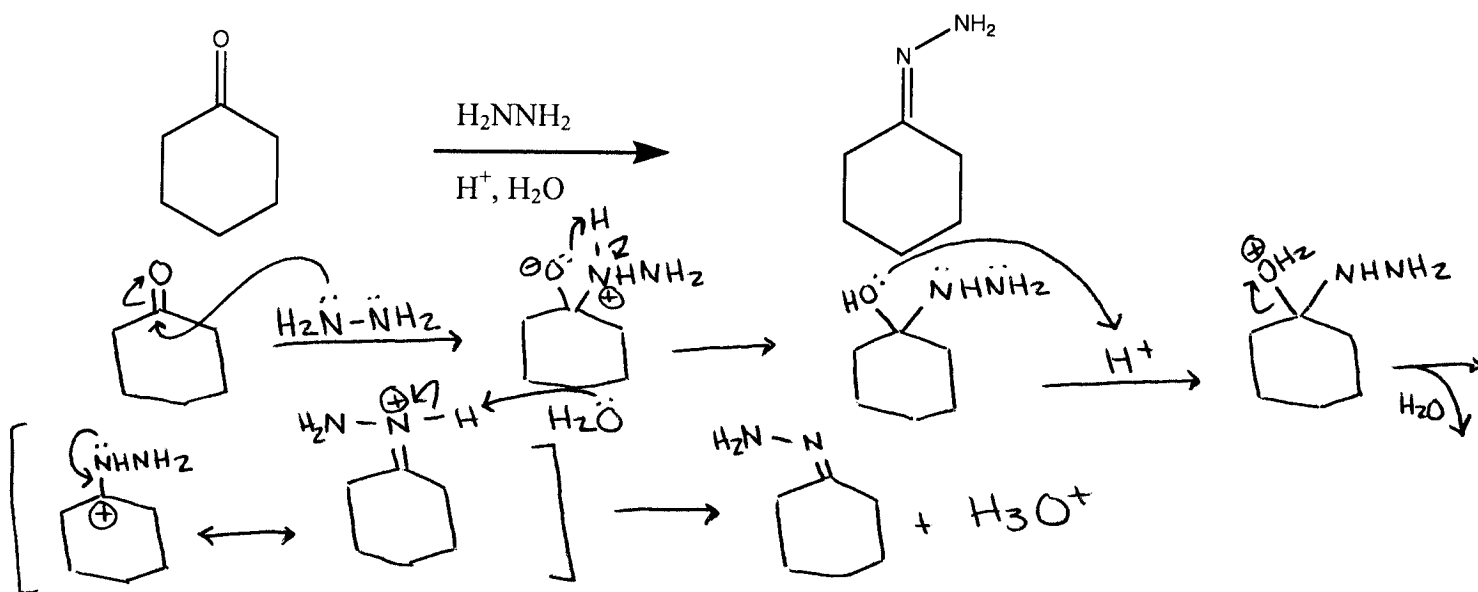
